USF School Uniform Policy

All children are expected to wear school uniform. Sweatshirt colours differ depending on the school e.g. St. Michael's - blue, St. Catherine's - green, St. Mary's - blue, Marldon - red, Ipplepen - blue.

Our school uniform is:-

- School sweatshirt or sweat cardigan **with school logo** (or Froglets logo for Nursery children at St. Michael's).
- White polo shirt or short sleeved shirt.
- Grey/black shorts/trousers/skirts/pinafore dress. Nursery children may also wear black jogging bottoms.
- Children can wear gingham dresses in the summer (school colour as mentioned above).
- School shoes must be worn to school. These can be black/brown sensible shoes, not trainers. But at break and lunchtimes children can wear trainers for running around.
- In the summer children can wear sturdy sandals which support their feet and have a back on them. Not flip flops.

Reversible coats, fleeces, woolly hats, baseball caps and school book bags with the school logo are also available from the school office.

(Swimming shorts and costumes with the school logo are also available at St. Michael's).

PE KIT

This should be kept in school from Monday to Friday in a named bag and must be a change from normal school uniform.

- Plain (white St. Michael's, St. Mary's and Marldon), yellow (St. Catherine's) T shirt or T shirt with school logo Ipplepen T Shirt in team colour.
- Plain black shorts
- Plimsolls or trainers (younger children need to have Velcro fasteners).
- A tracksuit may be worn in cold weather.

Swimming - children will need a swimming bag and towel. Boys will need plain swimming trunks or close fitting swimming shorts (baggy Bermuda type shorts can inhibit their ability to learn to swim and therefore children must not wear these). Girls will need a plain swimming costume.

NOTES

- Children are not to wear nail varnish or make up to school.
- Children with long hair need to have their hair tied back during the school day for health and safety reasons.
- All children need to have sensible haircuts. Children's hair must not be dyed.
- Children can wear watches.
- For Health and Safety reasons, the only jewellery that will be permitted in school is stud earrings for pierced ears. These are to be restricted to one stud per ear and must either be removed or taped for PE and Games.

Sun Safe

During the summer months the children are encouraged to bring a hat and sun cream, (which they can apply themselves). Parents might consider using 'day-long' sun cream which can be applied before school. Sun cream must be of a high factor to protect their skin.
